

Jodorowsky's Dune by Frank Pavich: Quebec premiere at Docville Thursday, March 27 at 8 pm at Cinéma Excentris



Montreal, Thursday, March 13, 2014 – The Montreal International Documentary Festival (RIDM) is ready for the third screening in its 2014 Docville series, with *Jodorowsky's Dune* by Frank Pavich. The film tells the extraordinary story of director Alejandro Jodoroswsky's attempt to make an adaptation of the classic science fiction novel *Dune*.

Jodorowsky's Dune had its world premiere at Cannes during the Directors' Fortnight and was a hit at Telluride, TIFF, Fantastic Fest (Best Documentary and Audience Award) and the Sitges Film Festival (Special Jury Mention and Audience Award); it will have its Quebec premiere on **Thursday, March 27** at 8 p.m. at Cinéma Excentris. Director Frank Pavich will participate in a Q&A via videoconference after the screening.

The adaptation project — as unlucky as it was grandiose — by cult director Alejandro Jodorowsky (*El Topo, The Holy Mountain, Santa Sangre*), fell apart after two years of work and millions of dollars spent, even though Jodorowsky had assembled a top-notch team of artists who had helped define modern science fiction filmmaking with their work on such films as *Alien, Blade Runner, Star Wars* and *Total Recall*.

In many cases, a Docville screening is the only chance to see the film on a big screen in Montreal, and the filmmakers often make themselves available for audience Q&A sessions.

Tickets for all Docville screenings are available from the Excentris box office and website (<u>cinemaexcentris.com</u>). Single screenings cost \$11.75 or \$9.25 for students and seniors. Transferable seven-admission cards are available for \$50 from the Excentris box office. The Docville series is presented by Télé-Québec and Canal D.
