## RETURNING THIS NOVEMBER 10 TO 20: THE RIDM ANNOUNCES FIVE MAJOR FILMS FROM THIS YEAR'S FESTIVAL

Montreal, August 10, 2016 – From November 10 to 20, the RIDM will hold its 19<sup>th</sup> annual festival. Today the Montreal International Documentary Festival (RIDM) is proud to unveil five major films from its program. This follows the June announcement of a retrospective showcasing the diversity and dynamism of animated documentaries.

A selection for official competition at the prestigious Visions du reel festival and winner of the Doc Alliance Selection Award at the Locarno International Film Festival, *Gulîstan, Land of Roses*, first feature by **Zaynê Akyol (Canada)**, a young Kurdish-Canadian filmmaker based in Quebec, will be presented at this year's Festival. Sublime images immerse viewers in the lives of a group of PKK's Kurdish female fighters who wage war on ISIS on the Iraqi and Syrian borders. *Gulîstan, Land of Roses* is produced by Périphéria, in coproduction with the German production company Mîtosfilm and the NFB.

Kate Plays Christine earned Robert Greene (United States) a Special Jury Award for writing at the 2016 Sundance Film Festival. This out-of-the-ordinary film redefines the boundary between documentary and performance by observing the work of a young actress preparing to play a television presenter who committed suicide on air. Kate Plays Christine is distributed in Canada by KinoSmith.

*Cinema Novo*, winner of the award for best documentary at the Cannes Festival, is made entirely from archival images related to the famous Brazilian movement. This beautiful, poetic essay by **Eryk Rocha** (**Brazil**) is both a history lesson and a filmmaking master class.

The great filmmaker **Wang Bing (China)** has made an unforgettable, arresting portrait of the lives of refugees in his latest film, *Ta'ang*. On the Chinese border, the Ta'ang people, fleeing a civil war, seek refuge in the mountains.

Voted best film in the international competition at Hot Docs 2016, *Brothers* is reminiscent of Richard Linklater's *Boyhood*. In this deeply sensitive film, a mother, *Aslaug Holm (Norway)*, documents the everyday lives of her two sons over a span of eight years.

## **Limited presales**

Starting today, the festival is releasing a limited number of passes good for all festival screenings (certain exceptions apply) at the special price of \$85 including taxes. The offer is valid until August 26. Official presales of passes (\$100) will begin on September 2.
